President's Report 2023

The Hills Community Kindergarten (THCK) is a **community-based** preschool organisation. Every year, the AGM presents an opportunity to reflect on the journey of growth, friendship and learning that our preschoolers have experienced, but also for our key stakeholders to note the outcomes of our collective efforts and the meaningful engagements made within our early childhood community. It is a testament to the dedication of this collective team, that despite the unique challenges faced in early childhood education, we have not only navigated through them but have also thrived and strengthened our commitment to providing quality learning experiences for our children.

It was wonderful to see so many involved and supporting our community culture throughout the years. 2023 was no exception, with the 50th Birthday Fete marking a very special day for our preschool, celebrating 50 years and the many achievements and milestones that have happened over that time. It was in 1973 that the preschool first opened its doors and 50 years on, under the wonderful leadership of Allison McCartney, you feel nothing but joy walking through those gates.
